

Describing features of a web page

- Hyperlinks – Hyperlinks make it able for you to go to a different page without having to enter the address of the page you want into the address bar. A hyperlink can also allow you to download a file from the websites directory.
- Action buttons – An action button is something like a Back arrow which takes you back to the page you were on. They can also put you forward a page if you have clicked the Forward arrow.
- Hot spots – With a hotspot you're able to make an image into a link. You have to click on the image to make this possible. Normally a hand image will replace your cursor if you're able to click on the image. This image works the same as a hyperlink there is just no text.
- Templates – A template could be a style sheet that is already made so that all of your pages have the same font and the same font size for the correct areas. There can also be templates for the whole website itself so that you only have to fill in the areas needed.
- Email links – An email link is normally provided on a website if you want the user to contact you or have the possibility to contact you. On some sites the email link can open Microsoft outlook if you have it installed on your computer. Outlook will already have the email address entered so that you're able to contact the email owner.
